# **Adaptive and Resilient City**

Council can play a crucial role in leading decarbonisation, funding resilience activities and ensuring that all members of our diverse community can enjoy a safe and liveable future.

The climate emergency impacts everyone, not just homeowners; all Council initiatives must consider equity so no one is left behind.

- Integrate coastal hazard and flood risk assessment into the planning scheme and infrastructure investment
- Integrate active transport, local community facilities and tree canopy into urban renewal projects
- Reduce car dependence by improving public transport, walking and bike riding routes
- Invest Council money ethically, divesting from fossil fuels, gambling, and tobacco
- Consider climate impact in all procurement and purchasing



The October Council elections are a critical moment for Port Phillip.

Since 2020, out of touch councillors have held back climate action, ignoring present and future climate impacts.

When you vote, remember that the Liberal and Residents of Port Phillip councillors have voted against or abstained from every substantial climate motion in the last four years.

# Change our Council Change our **Future**

As climate change impacts accelerate, some councillors are putting the brakes on action to tackle the climate emergency!



We call on all candidates to pledge their support for strong climate action.

## **Mobilise Our Community**

Our whole community must act on climate change, including businesses, industry, and residents, not just Council.

We call on Port Phillip council to inform, enable and involve our enthusiastic and capable local community:

- Establish a representative
   Community Reference Group to inform and advise Council on climate and social issues
- Establish a Community Energy
  Grants Program, targeting solar
  panel installation and household
  electrification
- Produce quarterly reports on Council's climate initiatives
- Fund the EcoCentre to support community education and collaborate on Council initiatives

These commitments foster community ownership in tackling the climate emergency and ensure regular updates on climate actions.

### Green, Cool and Liveable

Port Phillip's tree canopy is a vital tool in mitigation and adaptation, and delivers massive benefits across health, climate and amenity:

- Accelerate tree planting to reduce the urban heat effect
- Use a data-driven approach to prioritise areas of greatest need
- Facilitate community planting on private and public land
- Require deep soil zones and tree planting on new developments
- Implement a tree register to **protect** significant trees
- Increase public parks to ensure equitable access to open space

# **Water-Sensitive City**

As climate impacts and rainfall extremes amplify, Port Phillip must better manage water to adapt to drought, sea level rise and flooding:

- Reduce mains water use through stormwater harvesting projects
- Implement catchment-based water management strategies
- Expand permeable surfaces to reduce water run-off

#### **Eliminate Emissions**

Decarbonisation requires action from each sector of Port Phillip:

- Broker power purchase agreements for residential, commercial and industry sectors
- Accelerate the transition to electric vehicles by facilitating public and private EV charging
- Reduce committed emissions through zero carbon standards for new building developments
- Electrify Council fleet with all new Council vehicles 100% electric
- Install solar panels on Council buildings to achieve 100% local electricity generation
- Develop a community battery program to harness off-grid solar
- **Decommission gas connections** in Council buildings

#### **Reduce Waste**

To achieve waste reduction targets, we call on Council to:

- Support businesses to adopt circular economy practices
- Reduce waste to landfill by 75% via FOGO diversion, container deposit location expansion and education
