I was a former Vice President and Outer East Branch Convenor of the Public Transport Users (PTUA) where I successfully advocated for public transport frequency upgrades and the abolition of zone three fares which created inequities in transport access.

I was a former Mayor and Councillor for Maroondah City Council (2005-2012) where I successfully pushed Council into establishing a Sustainability team, which led to successfully reducing energy, waste and water usage. I strengthened design principles, requiring all new Council facilities to embed environmental sustainability, this led to further reductions in water and energy usage.

During my time on Council, Maroondah went from being an environmental laggard to then taking leadership through the Eastern Alliance for Greenhouse Action (EAGA). At the time (2010) I looked towards Councils like Port Phillip for their environmental leadership, unfortunately just 10 years later Port Phillip Council has absconded its leadership role.

I will restore Port Phillip's commitment to climate leadership and will work with the community to make that happen.
